Vladimir Ippolitovich Vetrov (Russian: Владимир Иванович Ветров; 10 October 1932 – 23 January 1985) was a high-ranking KGB spy during the Cold War who decided to covertly release valuable information to France and NATO on the Soviet Union's clandestine program aimed at stealing technology from the West. Home of the Modern Library, renowned publisher of classics, chronicles, essential writings, and translations. Includes the Bantam Classics line of titles for high school and college students, and the authorized Royal Shakespeare Company editions. When Keynes died, in April 1946, The Times of London gave him the best farewell since Nelson after Trafalgar: "To find an economist of comparable influence one would have to go back to Adam Smith."
