Spiritualism is a religious movement based on the belief that the spirits of the dead exist and have both the ability and the inclination to communicate with the living. The afterlife, or the "spirit world", is seen by spiritualists, not as a static place, but as one in which spirits continue to evolve. These two beliefs — that contact with spirits is possible, and that spirits are more ... William James (1842–1910) was an American philosopher and psychologist, and the first educator to offer a psychology course in the United States. James was a leading thinker of the late nineteenth century, one of the most influential U.S. philosophers, and has been labelled the "Father of American psychology". Edward C. Hegeler was born in 1835 in Bremen, Germany. His father had visited America and believed that Edward, the youngest, should be chosen to leave his homeland and make his mark in the much newer U.S. In the early 1870s the counties of Labette and Montgomery in Kansas were experiencing an alarming number of missing persons.
