

Download Out Skerries: An Island Community

What's your Visit Skerries reason? Walking. Take a stroll along one of the twenty dedicated walking routes in Skerries, one of which is the popular stroll along the South Beach and around Skerries Head which takes in views of the Mourne Mountains and the Island of Lambay, Shenick, St Patrick's, Colt and Rockabill Lighthouse. A skerry is a small rocky island, usually too small for human habitation. It may simply be a rocky reef. A skerry can also be called a low sea stack. A skerry may have vegetative life such as moss and small, hardy grasses. They also, in some areas of the world, are rested upon by animals such as seals or birds, though usually not inhabited. Education. The town has one-second level institution, Skerries Community College, originally named the Holy Faith/De La Salle College. The college originates from 1982, following a merger of the De La Salle College, Skerries Vocational School, and the Holy Faith Convent. Lambay Island is situated about six miles from Skerries. It is the largest island off the east coast of Ireland and is about 1,371 acres in size.
