Gregg Hurwitz's Penguin: Pain and Prejudice has some things going for it, but I don't think it's the "Killing Joke" of Penguin stories that some have professed it to be. The graphic novel tells the origin of Oswald Chesterfield Cobblepot, a.k.a. "the Penguin," a deformed crime kingpin and famous foe of the Batman. That's just a part of the idea writer Gregg Hurwitz is taking in to his new DC Comics miniseries "Penguin: Pain And Prejudice." The five-part miniseries, announced exclusively on CBR earlier this week, focuses on the origins of Oswald Cobblepot from high society outcast to Gotham crime lord. PENGUIN: PAIN AND PREJUDICE is a wonderful case study on one of Batman's oldest foes that has given me a new outlook on Cobblepot. There have been Penguin stories before, but this might be the best one yet. You can call it Penguin's own Killing Joke, if you will. Dark, insightful, creepy, and just plain awesome. Penguin: Pain and Prejudice is a must pick up for Penguin fans and those who truly want a great Penguin story. The painful and dark past of one of Batman's most devious foes is examined. How did young Oswald Cobblepot go from being the apple of his mother's eye to the leader of underworld gangs and adversary of the Caped Crusader?, Penguin Pain Prejudice Gregg Hurwitz.
